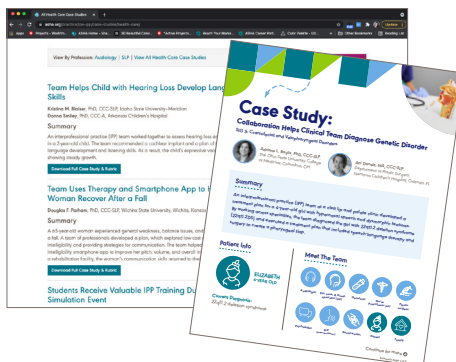

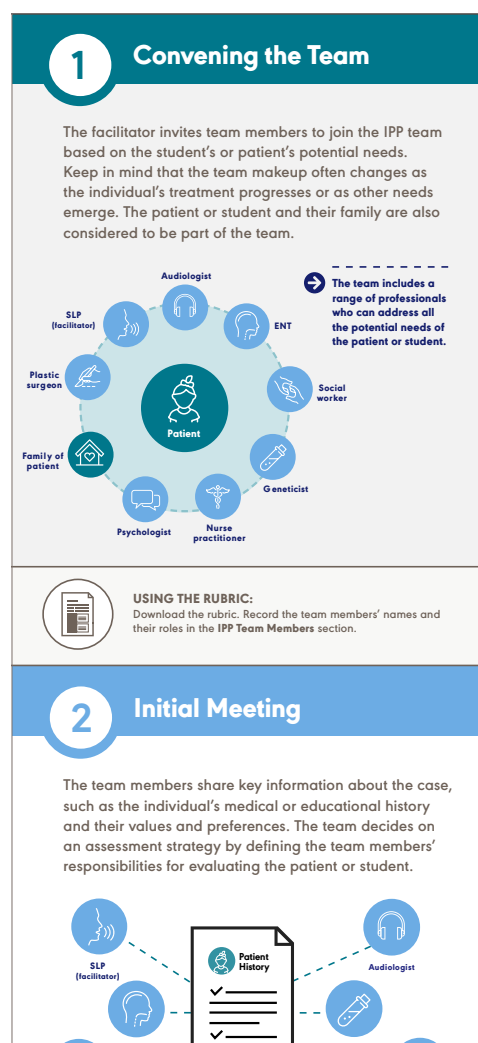

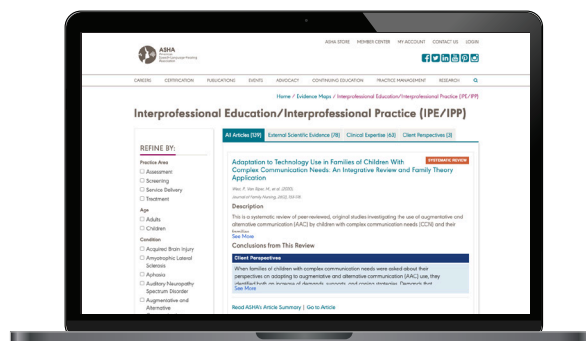
■ HOW TO: SET UP AND RUN YOUR IPP TEAM
